Different towns have different approaches. We need to decide on the approach. Bedford has a drop off site that is open twice a week. It includes black plastic. What do they do with it?

We have a list of all of the restaurants in Town. 'Food Establishment' includes restaurants and grocery stores. Need to determine what they use regarding prepared food trays and cutlery.

The Board of Health will be the enforcing agency of the proposed bylaw.

The MRFs cannot process the black plastic.

What we really want is to ban items that cannot be recycled and cannot be composted.
